Adventure to Australia!

This half-term we will be travelling to the other side of the Earth to Australia with its sprawling red deserts, sparkling modern cities, tropical rainforests teeming with exotic life and snow-capped mountain ranges.

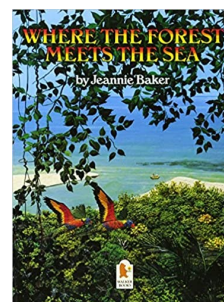
We will start our topic by learning all about biomes. We will learn what a biome zone is, identify different biomes, and how we can map areas of the world by their biomes. Then, we will take a closer look at the biomes of Australia and compare it to biomes of the Himalayas.

We will also be learning about the human and physical geographical features of Australia and researching some of the most famous landmarks. We will be considering why Australia is a popular place for tourists to visit and how tourism contributes to life there.

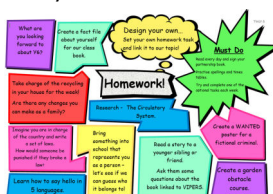


Homework

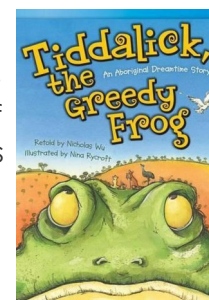


English

In English this half term, we will be focussing on a book called 'Tiddalick the Greedy Frog'. This is an aboriginal dreamtime story, linking to our topic 'Adventure to Australia'. We will begin by reading the book thoroughly and identifying the features of a narrative. We will look at what makes a narrative engaging through expanded noun phrases. We will then write our own aboriginal dreamtime story with a similar structure to 'Tiddalick'.

After completing the narrative, we will move to a different purpose: persuasion. We want to persuade people to travel across the world and visit Australia. We will look at persuasive features that convince a reader to change their mind.

Following the persuasive text, we will be writing a non-chronological report about Australia. We will concentrate on the organisation of our writing, building a structure that enhances the readers' experiences and conveys a informative text.



Maths

In Year 5, we are delving deep into the fascinating world of mathematics, exploring concepts that form the foundation of problem-solving and critical thinking. One area of focus is understanding and mastering the concept of area. Through engaging activities and real-world examples, we guide students to comprehend how to calculate the area of various shapes, such as rectangles, triangles, and parallelograms. By employing hands-on tasks and visual aids, we foster a concrete understanding of the relationship between length and width and how they contribute to determining the total space enclosed within a shape.

In addition to area, Year 5 students will be immersed in the captivating realm of statistics. Through interactive lessons and collaborative projects, we equip students with the skills to collect, organize, and interpret data effectively. They learn how to construct and analyse various types of graphs, including bar graphs, line graphs, and pie charts, enabling them to visualize and comprehend numerical information with ease.

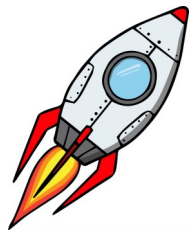
