Topic

This half term our topic is a geography focus called ‘Where Are We?’ The children will learn about the four countries of the UK, their capital cities and the surrounding seas. They will learn what human and physical features are and be able to identify them as well as making comparisons between two different places.

The children will also have lots of opportunities to use maps and atlases. They will need to use them to name and locate the world’s oceans and continents.

To make this topic even more special, our trip this half term will be to Stonehurst Farm! This will be a great opportunity to identify human and physical geographical features in person, look at some amazing classic cars and motorbikes in the museum as well as meeting lots of cute animals!

English

This half term, our writing will be based on the story ‘Meerkat Mail’ by Emily Gravett. Over the half term, we will continue to focus on sentence structure and remembering to use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.

The children will also be using ‘and’, ‘but’ and ‘or’ to join clauses and to create compound sentences. This will make their sentences even more exciting!

Remember, whenever we want to write a sentence we must... “Think it, like it, say it, write it, check it”. Practice this at home!



Maths

This half term, Year 1 and 2 will continue their learning on addition and subtraction. They will use a variety of resources to support them in answering mathematical calculations. In Year 1, the children will look closely at number bonds to and within 10. The children in Year 2 will be working with 2-digit numbers up to 100. All pupils will be looking at related number facts and solving missing number problems.

We will also continue with our big push on times-tables, as these form an important basis for many areas of the maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to access TT Rockstars as often as possible to support them with this essential knowledge.

The children's usernames can be found in the front of their partnership books.

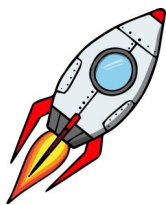
