


The Glapton Academy Year 3/4 Newsletter



<u>Topic</u>

Our topic this half term is Stone Age to Iron Age. We will be delving into the history books to learn about the three different eras of the Stone Age. Our key focus will be on how people survived during these periods of history, identifying the tools and materials they used and how these developed over time. We will also develop our knowledge of how history is recorded by looking at timelines and a variety of sources.

Studying the Stone Age will help children to develop their investigation and evaluation skills; learn to organise information chronologically and understand how past events have helped to shape the world we know today.




Book recommendation

fit in with their busy schedules at home.




<u>English</u>

In English this term, we will be exploring the Stone Age through the story, Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitmaura. We will be studying a variety of text types including narratives, instructions and diary recounts in order to support us when we are creating our own versions.

We will also be working hard to improve our GPS (grammar, punctuation and spelling) skills through the use of Writing LEAPs. We will begin this term by learning about different word classes and how we can add more detail into our writing by using conjunctions.

In reading, we will be developing a range of skills, such as inference, retrieval and predication, in order to locate information and evidence within a text and to infer how a character will be feeling and make sensible predictions about what might happen next in the story.



<u>Maths</u>

In our maths lessons this half term, we will be continuing to practise reading and writing numerals, recognising and understanding place value up to three digit numbers and using our reasoning skills to solve number and words problems. We will also be securing fluency in addition and subtraction particularly in regards to mental arithmetic.

We will continue with our big push on times-tables, as these form an important basis for many areas of the maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to access TT Rockstars as often as possible to support them with this essential knowledge.
