Propaganda is information designed to influence people's opinions or behaviour.

It often uses emotions and persuasive messages to shape what people think.

Ancient Egyptian civilisation existed along the Nile River in northeast Africa. It lasted for thousands of vears, starting around 3100 BC.

Egyptians built pyramids, temples, and developed writing called hieroalyphs.

Egyptian monuments and art showed the power of pharaohs and gods.

Large pyramids were tombs for pharaohs. showing their importance.

Art often included symbols of strength, protection, and leadership.

World War II started in 1939 because of political tensions and invasions by Nazi Germany. Germany, led by Adolf Hitler wanted to expand

territory and

power.

Other countries formed alliances to stop Germany's aggression.

Life in Britain durina World War II included rationing food and resources.

People experienced air raids and had to use shelters for safety.

Many worked in factories or joined the military to support the war effort.

British propaganda used posters, films, and radio to encourage support for the war.

Messages promoted rationing, enlistment, and keeping morale hiah.

Propaganda helped unite people and spread important information.

Nazi Germany used propaganda to promote Nazi ideas and control people.

It spread messages of hate against certain groups, especially Jews.


