Enquiry

Our enquiry question this term is 'What is the impact of propaganda on society?'

To be able to answer this question, we will be learning about how propaganda was used in Ancient Egypt, World War II and the modern day. We will be learning about the techniques of propaganda, how it was used and who it may have influenced. Looking into and comparing two very different times gives the children different perspectives and allows them to develop their investigation skills, learn to organise information chronologically and understand how past events have helped to shape the world we know today.





Book recommendation

Homework given will always be a consolidation of learning that has taken place in school.


Year 6 children will be set their weekly homework using an online tracker and we hope to share more information with you about this soon.

English

In English this term, we will be exploring World War II through the book, Rose Blanche by Ian McEwan. We will be studying a variety of text types including narratives, setting descriptions and diary recounts in order to support us when creating our own versions.

We will also be working hard to improve our GPS (grammar, punctuation and spelling) skills through the use of writing. We will begin this term by learning about different sentence structures and how to improve our writing.

In reading, we will be developing a range of skills, such as inference, retrieval, predication, dictionary skills and explanation in order to really understand and use the skills needed to locate, define, explain words, sentences and paragraphs within text.



Maths

This half term, the children will be learning about place value. Year 5 will work with numbers up to one million, practise rounding and use negative numbers, while Year 6 will extend this to ten million and apply their skills in real-life contexts such as temperature. After this, both year groups will move on to the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division), building accuracy and confidence when working with larger numbers.

We will continue with our big push on times-tables, as these form an important basis for many areas of the maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to access TT Rockstars as often as possible to support them with this essential knowledge.

The children's usernames will be added to the children's Reading Records.
