


Little, Brown Nut by Mary Auld

Interest age: 3-6




Little Tree and the Wood Wide Web by Lucy Brownridge


Our Tower by Joseph Coelho




Ways to Say I Love You by Madeleine Cook


Gory Rory Fangface Needs A Kiss by Ziggy Hanaor




The Best Me! by Marvyn Harrison




Lost by Mariajo Ilustrajo

Interest age: 3-6




Who Rules The Rockpool? by Matty Long

Interest age: 6-8






Julian at the Wedding by Jessica Love

Interest age: 3-6




The Kindest Red by S.K. Ali and Ibtihaj Muhammad




Wild Book Day by Karl Newson




Meesha Makes Friends by Tom Percival

Interest age: 4-5




Amara and the Bats by Emma Reynolds

Interest age: 6-8




Up High by Matt Hunt
