

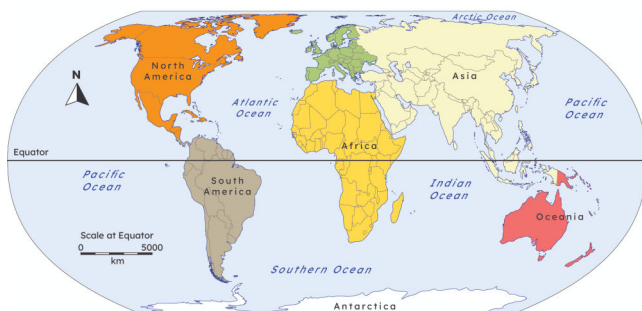

Homework will provide an opportunity for children to consolidate their learning in Maths and English that has taken place in school. This will be set weekly.

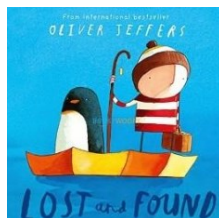
Throughout this Block of learning we would love for you to make your own world map and add interesting facts to it.

During this block, we will be focusing on our place value skills using pictorial and concrete representations.

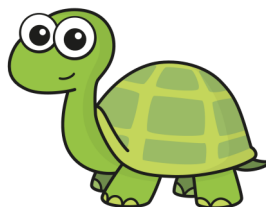
In Year 1, we will be:

There will be some class battles. Time to take on the other classes.

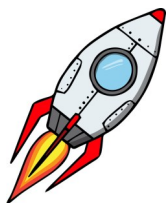
