Rhyming helps children to break words down and to hear the sounds that make up words in preparation for reading and writing. Because of this, we are working as a school to expose children from Nursery through to Year 6 to a wide variety of nursery rhymes and poems. Every half term, children are being sent poems and rhymes to learn off by heart at home which we will practise and perform in class. We hope that you will support your children to do this.
