Spring Term Two 2021



Topic

This half term the children will be learning about Electricity and two of the most important scientific inventors in the field of electricity – Thomas Edison and Nikola Tesla.

The children will learn to represent circuits using symbols in a diagram and will be developing their understanding of what electricity is and how to measure it. They will also be comparing and giving reasons for variations in how components function, including the brightness of bulbs, the loudness of buzzers and the on/off position of switches.

As well as conducting an investigation of their choice, the children will get the opportunity to create their own game!

This book is filled with gruesome facts - the perfect book for people who love science!




Homework

to fit in with their busy schedules at home.




English

In English this term, we will be exploring a range of fiction texts whilst reading the novel 'Skellig' by David Almond. We will be studying a variety of text types including character descriptions, myths and legends and poetry with a specific focus of the power of imagery.

We will also be working hard to improve our GPS (grammar, punctuation and spelling) skills through the use of Writing LEAPs. We will begin this term by learning how to use expanded noun phrases effectively to add detail, quality and precision to our sentences.

In reading, we will be continuing to work on our VIPERS skills, specifically finding and explaining the meaning of words in a context. We will then apply this vocabulary to our own writing.



Maths

This half term, we will begin by recapping our fractions knowledge. We will reconsolidate our learning of finding equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions and converting between improper and mixed number fractions.

Once we are secure in these areas, we will move on to: adding and subtract fractions with different denominators using the concept of equivalent fractions, and mixed numbers; multiplying simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in its simplest form and dividing proper fractions by whole numbers. After this, we will learn to associate a fraction with division and calculate decimal fraction equivalents (e.g. 0.375) for a simple fraction (e.g. $\frac{3}{8}$) before moving onto our decimals and percentages unit in the Summer term.

We will also continue with our big push on times-tables, as these form an important basis for many areas of the maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to access TT Rockstars as often as possible to support them with this essential knowledge.
