BIRCH CLASS ARRANGEMENTS

Those in Birch class who have completed 10 days isolation are invited to school briefly on the morning of Tuesday 27 July at 9.30am. This will give them the opportunity to collect their Leavers Hoodie and belongings, and say their goodbyes. Parents will need to wait at the Manor Farm Lane gate and we still recommend social distancing and the wearing of a face covering. If any children remain in isolation on this day they will either be able to nominate someone to collect their belongings or arrange for collection in September.

UPDATE ON RESTRICTIONS UNTIL THE END OF TERM



We are keeping the majority of our COVID safety restrictions in place until the end of term. September will be our return to normal (fingers crossed). The biggest change this week is the end of sending home whole Bubbles to self-isolate. From Monday 19 July, **schools must not send home close contacts** of positive cases (often-whole bubbles) of either pupils or staff home to self-isolate **unless they are instructed to do so by NHS Test and Trace.**

The letters sent home on Friday were comprehensive, but in summary:

- In the event of a confirmed positive case, classes or bubbles will not **immediately** be sent home by the school.
- School will now not routinely inform you of a positive case either within the classroom or whole school.
- You as parents do not need to do anything in addition to the good practices that you are already doing.
- Children and staff will be contacted by NHS Test & Trace if they need to isolate.
- Being together in an educational setting is no longer assumed as being a close contact.
- Staff will only isolate if they personally have symptoms/tested positive, or if they receive an alert from NHS Test & Trace to isolate.
- We will continue to send symptomatic children home and ask parents/carers to keep children who have symptoms at home. Please then follow the symptoms/testing guidance at the end of this letter.

Our Stay Safe Charter will remain in place in September with reference to our containment room for children or staff with symptoms, regular cleaning, handwashing on entry to school and respiratory care.

END OF TERM GIFTS

Several parents have kindly asked if staff are able to receive end of term gifts and cards. This is perfectly fine as gifts may be quarantined over the weekend. Gifts and cards are certainly not expected, but we do thank you for your support, thoughts and kind words.

UNIFORM

Children will need to return to school in full school uniform as follows:

- Red jumper or cardigan containing the school logo
- White polo shirt with the school logo
- Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore
- Red gingham summer dress
- Plain red, black, white or grey tights
- White, black, red or grey socks for girls
- Grey or black socks for boys
- Black shoes (not trainers or plimsolls)
- No nail varnish
- Earrings should be plain gold/silver studs and a watch can be worn when a child can tell the time
- Long hair should be tied back with plain, simple bobbles and headbands in line with school colours


- Y2 to Y6 will line up the KS2 playground with the bell ringing at 8.45am

Your child will be bringing home a Knowledge Organiser detailing all of the interesting things they will be learning about in the autumn term. The Knowledge Organiser also contains a QR code that you can scan for your child to start some summer research and hopefully start to get excited about their learning ahead.

NEW BUILDING

Work on the new building is due to commence in July. As you know, the plan is to join the two buildings to create a wonderful school library, covered access from the KS1 building to the KS2 building, a staff room which will accommodate the whole team and a Headteacher office in the centre of the school.



Access to main reception will be via the Glapton Lane Nursery Pedestrian Gate and visitors will need to ring the intercom. We are expecting a huge reduction in footfall to reception in the morning now that all payments are made online. All queries can be addressed using the Partnership Book, as well as by telephone and e-mail.

All staff will be outside on the playgrounds every morning to greet you and deal with any queries at the beginning and end of each day.
