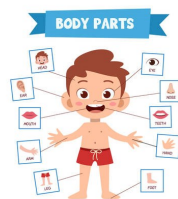


Topic

Our topic for this half term is 'The Great Outdoors'.

We will have a Science and Geography theme running throughout this topic. In Geography, we will be focusing on our local area. We will learn about the human and physical features of our local area and compare them to another part of the World. We will also be observing what is near and far in our local area. We will also be using locational and directional language to describe features on a map.

In Science, we will be learning all about the human body, including body parts and our senses. We will be labelling the human body, including our own! We will also be learning the 5 senses and which body parts are associated with those senses.



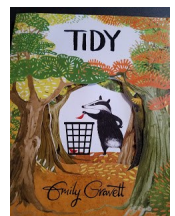

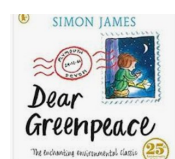

English

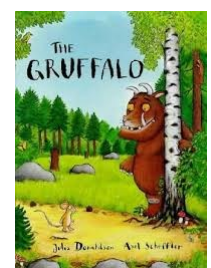
Our focus book for our 'Great Outdoors' topic will be The Gruffalo by Julia Donaldson.

We will be writing labels and captions for the characters in the story. We will also have a focus on sentence structure where children will gain understanding of what a noun, adjective and verb is and where it is placed in a sentence. They will also be reminded of using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops in all sentences.

We will then write a character description about one of the characters from The Gruffalo.

We will be practising our cursive handwriting and keeping all letters sitting on the line.

In reading, we will be reading back through our work to check it makes sense, ask questions about a story and begin to identify key features of a fiction book.



Maths

In our maths lessons this half term, we will be focusing on Place Value and Number up to 10 and 20.

We will be reading, writing and counting the numbers up to 10 and 20 both forwards and backwards. We will use number lines, objects and pictures to help us do this.

We will be saying what is one more and one less than a given number up to 10 and 20 and comparing numbers using greater than, less than and equals to.

Other things you can do at home.

- Counting steps on different journeys. How high can you count?
- How many times can you catch a ball?
- Write numbers forwards and backwards– you could use chalk outside or use toys to help you.
- Get to know your left, right, forward and back.

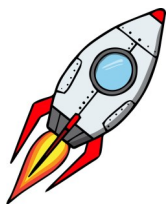
