
Topic



English

Our focus book for our 'Arctic Adventures' topic will be Lost and Found by Oliver Jeffers.

We will be writing some shape poems to start the half term, we will practise using a capital letter to start each line.

We will be writing a setting description about the Arctic, we will be writing short sentences to form a narrative and using adjectives to describe the location.

Finally, we will be writing a non-chronological report about a Polar animal where we will be writing questions and joining words within a sentence using 'and'.

We will be practising our handwriting and keeping all letters sitting on the line.

We will also be putting finger spaces between words and ending our sentences with a full stop.



Maths

In our maths lessons this half term, we will be finishing off Place Value to 20 and then moving onto the place value of numbers up to 50 and 100.

We will be reading, writing and counting the numbers up to 20, 50 and 100 both forwards and backwards. We will use number lines, objects and pictures to help us do this.

We will be saying what is one more and one less than a given number up to 20, 50 and 100 and comparing numbers using greater than, less than and equals to.

Other things you can do at home.

- Counting steps on different journeys. How high can you count?
- How many times can you catch a ball?
- Write numbers forwards and backwards– you could use chalk outside or use toys to help you.
- Get to know your left, right, forward and back.
