### Spring Term 2 - 2022

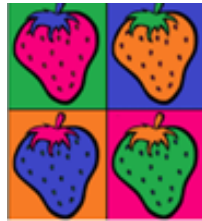


#### Topic

This half term our topic is a science, art and design and technology focus called 'Magnificent Machines'. The children will learn and practice a range of art techniques such as drawing and printing to replicate patterns and texture. All of their art this half term will be based on the art movement of 'Pop Art' and will look closely at artwork produced by Andy Warhol.

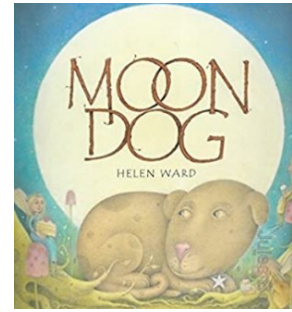
In DT, the children will use their knowledge of materials learnt in our previous science lessons to create a product with wheels and axles. They will follow the design process through Stem Week to reach their final product.

In Science we will continue to learn about everyday materials. The children will conduct experiments to discover the properties of different materials.

#### Homework

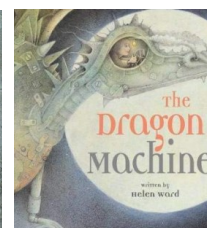
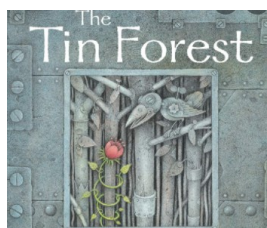

#### English

This half term, our writing will be based on the story 'The Dragon Machine' by Helen Ward. Over the six weeks, we will write a character description, diary entry and a non-chronological report. Some new writing skills the children will learn in this block are exclamation sentences, a wider range of time connectives and suffixes. Throughout the children's writing, we will be looking for other skills they learnt so far in Year 2 like expanded noun phrases, adverbs, coordinating and subordinating conjunctions.

In VIPERS we will be reading the book "The Tin Forest" by Helen Ward.



### Maths

This half term, Year 2 will be learning about shape and fractions.

They will first recap their knowledge of 2D and 3D shapes and then move onto describing their properties. This is the number of sides, edges, vertices, faces and lines of symmetry. Then, the children will be able to compare shapes based on their properties.

During the fractions lessons, Year 2 will find, name and write fractions for  $\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $\frac{1}{3}$  and  $\frac{1}{4}$  when looking at shapes, lengths and amounts.

We will also continue with our big push on times-tables, as these form an important basis for many areas of the maths curriculum. Please encourage your child to access TT Rockstars as often as possible to support them with this essential knowledge.

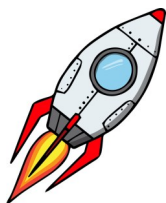
