

Go on a minibeast hunt in your garden, park or other outside area. Try looking under plant pots or stones, on leaves and bushes or on some flowers. Take a photo or draw the minibeasts you find.

Make a minibeast out of your recycling. You could use cardboard boxes and tubes, yoghurt pots or plastic bottles. You could make a butterfly, worm, ladybird or spider or choose your own minibeast to make.

Draw or paint a picture of a butterfly. Can you make the wings symmetrical? Tell an adult at home about the life cycle of a butterfly.

Try growing some plants or flowers at home. You could try planting some seeds in a pot or in your garden. Remember to water your seeds and put them somewhere sunny.

Visit the local library and choose a non-fiction book about an animal of your choice. Read it with an adult and write down one thing you found out.

Play with a range of different containers in the sink or in the bath. Can you show a container that is empty, full, half empty, half full, nearly empty and nearly full?

Write a list of animals that often live on farms. Can you name their babies?

Go on a spring walk, what signs of spring can you spot? Can you draw what you saw?
