Topic


This half term in Year 6 we are going to be exploring The Amazing Americas!

To begin with, we will be finding out about the continents of North and South America and the countries that form them. We will then be looking in more detail at the human and physical features of the Americas with a focus on rivers and volcanoes. We will be locating rivers and volcanoes on a map, discovering their features, learning about how they are formed and discovering how and why they often change over time. Following this, we will be learning more about natural resources and their distribution.



Book recommendation

Homework

All children will be given homework on Sats Companion every Friday. This must be completed by the following Friday. Homework given will always be a reconsolidation of learning that has taken place in school.

Additionally, a homework menu will be provided each half term. These tasks will cover a range of skills and the children can complete as many tasks as they like.

English

In English this term, we will be focussing on spelling, grammar and punctuation skills leading up to the SAT tests.

In reading we will be working on improving our exam technique, by learning how to get maximum marks when answering comprehension questions. We will specifically be focussing on inference and deduction questions as well as questions related to the author's viewpoint.

We will be enjoying the novel 'Holes' by Louis Sachar as our class reader, and, following the SATs tests, will be basing our English writing unit (persuasive letter writing) upon characters and events that occur within the story.

As you can see, it is set to be a very busy week!

Maths

This half term in maths, we will begin by learning how to solve algebraic equations. We will need to remember to use the inverse calculations and keep the equation balanced throughout.

Here is an example if you would like to support your child at home with this.

$$\begin{array}{l} 8a - 5 = 11 \\ +5 \quad \quad \quad +5 \\ \hline 8a = 16 \\ \div 8 \quad \quad \quad \div 8 \\ \hline a = 2 \end{array}$$

Following our algebra unit, we will be investigating ratio and proportion and solving problems involving ratio relationships. In addition, we will be solving problems involving the relative sizes of two quantities where missing values can be found by using integer multiplication and division facts. After this, we will begin a short unit on statistics, focusing particularly on constructing and interpreting line graphs and pie charts.



In preparation for our arithmetic test on Wednesday 11th May, we will be doing lots of additional, fun arithmetic practice in the afternoons. We will be taking part in quizzes, treasure hunts and team games to support our understanding and confidence.
