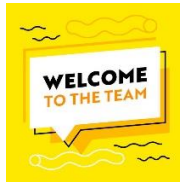




## SUMMER NEWSLETTER 2023 BLOCK 5

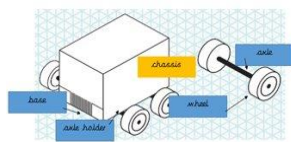
## **PARENT SURVEY**

## **STEM CHALLENGE WEEK**

The children had a whole week last block based around design technology projects. They were all involved in the design process and used their maths, technology and writing skills to enhance their design skills.

Reception made some incredible duckling transporters for their newly hatched ducklings to be taken to their new homes.

Y1 designed and made sliders and levers for creating a story book inspired by the traditional tale of Rapunzel and Rapunzel Once-Upon a World.

Y2 investigated vehicles with axles and wheels and then designed their own.

Y3 created some planters designed to support a variety of plants and Y4 designed and made some impressive greenhouse prototypes.

Y5 investigated pulley systems and designed prototype systems to collect water from a well.

Y6 designed and made cushion covers using textile and sewing skills. They based their designs around the recent natural disaster in Turkey and Syria creating cushions to support and comfort refugees.
