

## **Europe** is the continent we live on. It is divided into forty-five different countries. Each country in Europe has its own capital city, for example London, Paris, Madrid.

The water cycle is the journey water takes from the sky to land and then back.

A **river** is a moving body of water that flows from its source on high ground to lower ground. A river has three stages: upper course, middle course and lower course.



Rivers are important for lots of different reasons:

- Water for drinking and washing
- Agriculture
- Leisure
- Transportation
- Energy
