The children will be asked to share their ideas about which types of equipment or what items in particular they think they would need to take with them on an expedition. The children will also investigate the different types of transport they could use.

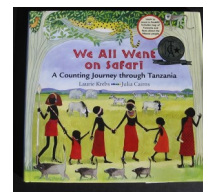

'We all went on Safari' is a beautifully illustrated book showing a counting journey of animals found in African continent in the country of Tanzania.

The book enables the reader to not only practise their counting and number recognition skills as they read but to experience and observe the different types of animals found in a country very different from our own as well as the native environment and the homes and clothes of the indigenous peoples found there.

The book also provides the correct vocabulary for the reader to count in Swahili.

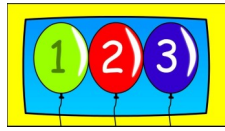

Literacy/Communication and Language

As part of our literacy curriculum the children will be listening to the stories 'Mole's Journey', 'We all went on Safari', 'Bumper to Bumper' and 'Let's get moving up a Mountain'. During their group reading experiences the children will continue to consolidate their knowledge of the different features of a book, that print carries meaning and that there are differences between a fiction and non-fiction texts.

In writing the children will continue to practise their pencil control skills using a range of overwriting opportunities, their name cards to copy and write letters from their names and by writing on large sheets of paper to allow large movement to develop hands wrist and finger muscles..

Maths



In Maths this half term the children will continue to practise their counting by rote and number recognition daily through adult led interactions and through activities provided by our continuous provision.

As before, please continue to practise counting and number recognition skills with your child whenever you can— some examples might be looking at and recognising door numbers or car number plates on the walk to school, counting how many cups or plates are needed at home for a family meal or counting foods as they are prepared for dinner.

This half term there will be a focus on encourage the children to count out objects to 5 pointing and counting each object individually as they do so and recognising that the end number counted is the total number of objects that the children have.
